

Spring Funding Round up

General/Core Costs/Misc

AB Charitable Trust: Grants for small to medium-sized charities registered and working in the UK that defend human rights and promote respect for vulnerable individuals. **Deadline 26th April, then 26th July 2024.**

Asda Foundation - Empowering Local Communities Grant: For community groups to support a broad range of activities which are transforming their community and improving the lives of people in their community. **Deadline 24th May.**

Britford Bridge Trust: Grants to charities involved in the prevention or relief of poverty; the advancement of education; the advancement of health or the saving of lives; and the advancement of the arts, culture, heritage or science. **Deadline 30th June.**

D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust: One off grants for charities working in the areas of advancement of the arts, health and medical welfare, and improvement or protection of the environment. **Deadline 23rd May.**

Hedley Foundation: Grants of up to £5000 for smaller charities operating across the spectrum of social need, particularly youth, disability, elderly and terminally ill. **Deadline 5th June.**

Leathersellers Foundation: Small, medium and large grants are available to support both specific project activity and unrestricted core costs of registered charities in the UK. **Deadline 24th April 2024.**

NFU Mutual Charitable Trust: Grants of up to £50,000 are available to large charitable groups and organisations for projects that further the objectives of the Trust, particularly those that educate young people in rural areas and the relief of poverty in rural areas. **Deadline 24th May.**

Postcode Local Trust: The funding aims to support smaller charities and good causes in the west of England to make a difference to their community for the benefit of people and planet. Grants between £500-£25,000 are available, applicants must have an income of less than £1 million in the past year. **Opens 27th May 2024 and closes 3rd June.**

Screwfix Foundation: Funding for charities and not-for-profit organisations to improve, fix, and repair buildings, homes and facilities specifically used by people in need across the UK. **Deadline 10th May.**

Wolfson Foundation: Capital infrastructure funding in the fields of science and medicine, heritage, arts and humanities, education, and health and disability. **Deadline 1st July.**

Hardship and Poverty

Asda Foundation - Cost of Living Grant: For local community groups who are affected by the increase in the cost of living. Volunteer-related costs, rent/utilities expenses and food/essentials are supported by this grant. **Deadline 24th May.**

B&Q Foundation Grant: One-off grants to charities for projects that improve homes and communities spaces for those who are experiencing homelessness, in financial hardship, impacted by health, disability or other disadvantage or distress. **Deadline 17th May.**

Help the Homeless Grant Scheme: Capital project grants are available to small and medium-sized charities working to assist homeless people to rebuild their lives and return to the community. **Deadline 15th June.**

Leeds Building Society Foundation: Small grants for charities with a turnover under £1 million undertaking projects to support those in need of a safe and secure home. **Deadline 10th June.**

One Stop Community Partnership Programme: Grants of £1000 available to support not-for-profit organisations with local community projects, within 2 miles of a One Stop store, that address social welfare and environmental issues. **Deadline 26th April and 26th July 2024.**

Warburtons Families Matter: Small grants of £400 for local projects, activities and organisations that have charitable aims and that will be of real direct benefit to families. The work should be working on either of the key themes: Health, Place and Skills. **Deadline 7th May.**

Health, Social Care, Wellbeing

Basil Houghton Trust: Grants are available for local charities working with people who have learning disabilities in Shropshire and Telford & Wrekin. Individuals may apply for £350 and organisations can apply for grants of £1200. **Deadline 17th June 2024.**

Hospital Saturday Fund: One-off grants are available to registered medically related charities for medical capital projects, medical care or research, medical training and running costs. **Deadline 1st May.**

James Tudor Foundation: Grants are available to UK registered charities for work in the areas of palliative care; medical research; health education; the direct relief of sickness; prevention and relief of sickness overseas. **Deadline 30th June 2024.**

Pink Ribbon Foundation: Funding projects and providing financial support to charities which relieve the needs of people who are suffering from, or who have been affected by breast cancer or who work to advance the understanding of breast cancer, its early detection and treatment. **Deadline 31st May.**

Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin Community Mental Health Fund for Adults: This round will offer digital inclusion grants aimed at voluntary, community, and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations that provide training and interactive training materials to secondary care mental health service users. You can apply for a grant between £1000-£20,000. **Deadline 14th June 2024.**

Environment and Energy

Climate Action Fund: Our Shared Future – The National Lottery Community Fund: Funding formal partnerships which link climate issues to people's everyday lives or influence communities regional or national. Applications can be made til the end of 2024. **Informational webinars taking place on the 16th and 21st of May.**

Cycling UK - Big Bike Revival Grants Programme: Grants for voluntary groups, social enterprises, and other not-for-profit organisations to deliver cycling projects and activities across England (outside of London) for people who do not normally cycle. **Deadline 25th June.**

Freedom Fibre Fund: Grants of up to £500 per organisation are available for not-for-profit community groups to deliver green and environmental projects and activities in North Shropshire where Freedom Fibre is rolling out its new full-fibre network. **Deadline 28th June 2024.**

Heat Network Efficiency Scheme: Grants for organisations operating across the public, private and third sectors in England and Wales to upgrade existing heat networks to reduce emissions and energy costs for households. **Deadline 10th May.**

Education, Children and Young People

Adamson Foundation: For voluntary and community organisations and charities to help with the cost of holidays or respite breaks for disabled children (aged 3 to 17 years) with physical, mental, or emotional impairments. **Deadline 30th June.**

Asda Foundation - U18 Better Start Grants: Aims to give children under 18 years old the best start in life by supporting a wide range of activities that improve the lives of children in the local community.

Deadline 24th May.

Comic Relief - Youth homelessness: Grants of up to £200,000 to support not-for-profit organisations that work to empower young people who are at immediate risk of, or experiencing homelessness to access the right support at the right time. **Deadline 7th May.**

Learning through Landscapes – Local School Nature Grants: Grants to provide outdoor learning training and equipment to schools and early years providers. **Deadline 26th April and 6th September 2024.**

Skipton Building Society Charitable Foundation: Grants are available to charities for work in that benefits children, through education, welfare, youth projects, and the elderly and their welfare. **Deadline 1st May.**

Tesco Footie for All: To support grassroots football clubs across the UK with a priority on supporting children up to the age of 18 access sport and physical activity and/or providing more equipment and opportunity for children. **Deadline 30th April.**

7Stars Foundation: Grants to support young people challenged by abuse and addiction, those who are young carers, and those who are homeless or without a safe place to call home. **Deadlines are quarterly, the next being 30th April 2024.**

Gender, Race, Migration, Social Justice

Baring Foundation: Unrestricted grants are available for civil society organisations who are small expert legal ‘hub’ organisations to help them scale up their hub activities to deliver positive social change for communities in the UK. **Deadline 30th April 2024.**

Comic Relief Community Justice Fund: Grants between £200,000 and £450,000 are available for not-for-profit organisations specialising in racial justice and/or gender justice and who are registered and delivering work in several areas including the West Midlands. Information sessions will be taking place in April. **Deadline 2nd May 2024.**

Hilden Charitable Fund: Grants for charitable organisations working in the areas of penal affairs and asylum seekers and refugees in the UK. **Deadline 14th May.**

Lloyds Bank Foundation for England and Wales - Racial Equity Grants: Unrestricted grants are available for small local organisations based outside of London who are working with people experiencing economic inequity because of their race or ethnicity. **Deadline 30th May.**

Weavers Company Benevolent Fund: Discretionary funds for charities and charitable incorporated organisations that can demonstrate impact with ex-offenders, young offenders or young people at risk of offending, either within a local area or nationally. **Deadline 4th July.**

Older People

Concertina Charitable Trust: Grants of £250 are available to registered charities to provide therapeutic musical activities and related facilities for the elderly community. **Deadline 30th April 2024.**

Home Instead Charities: For small grassroots community groups and small local registered charities that are providing activities and projects to prevent social isolation and loneliness for people over 55 in the UK. **Deadlines are quarterly, the next being 30th April 2024.**

Ironmongers Company: Grants for projects in the UK that provide opportunities for disadvantaged children and young people under the age of 25 years to fulfil their potential. **Deadline 31st July.**

Business, Digital Skills, Employment

Fat Beehive Foundation: Grants are available to small charities to help them improve their digital presence. **Deadline 28th June.**

Shackleton Foundation Grant: Seed funding grants and support are available to inspirational leaders and early stage social enterprises to establish non-profit ventures which provide solutions to social problems faced by disadvantaged and socially marginalised young people. **Deadlines are quarterly, the next being 29th April 2024.**

Thrive Together Fund – Social Investment Business: Provides a funding package of loan (75%) and grant (25%) for small and medium sized charities and social enterprises, who are looking to grow or diversify their business models.

Churches

ChurchCare: Anglican parish churches in England can apply for a range of grants for the conservation of organs and organ cases, books and manuscripts, church plates, churchyard structures, metalwork, monuments, textiles, woodwork/wooden objects. **Deadline 3rd June/10th June depending on the grant.**

Congregational and General Charitable Trust Grants: Grants between £1000-£25,000 available to support the provisions and repair of church buildings, particularly those of the United Reformed and Congregational denominations. **Deadline 2nd May.**

National Churches Trust: Small and large grants programme for listed and unlisted Christian places of worship of any denomination in the UK to support interventions to investigate or address small problems before they turn into large, expensive repairs. **Deadline for small grants 30th April, 2nd July for large grants.**

Animals

Jean Sainsbury Animal Welfare Trust: Discretionary grants for charities for projects or activities in the UK that benefit and protect animals, relieve the suffering of animals, address the conservation of wildlife or encourage a greater understanding of animals. **Deadline 1st May.**

Veterans

Army Benevolent Fund: Funding to support charities and organisations with projects and activities that directly benefit the Army community in six key areas: independent living, elderly care, education and employability, mental fitness, families and housing. **Deadline 3rd May.**
